# About Us

Southeastern Education and Economic Development (SEED) is an initiative of the NC Business Committee for Education, sponsored by Smithfield Foods. SEED is focused on growing eastern NC's advanced manufacturing and agriculture workforce through work-based learning and pre-apprenticeships. This summer, the program is launching two pathways in Industrial Systems and Agriculture.
